Bob Oberdorfer is a registered landscape architect and environmental planner with a strong focus on ecologically responsible design practices and inventive, yet practical, problem-solving. His projects have included feasibility studies, design, and construction observation for streetscapes, parks, trails, playgrounds, and other recreational facilities. He provides design oversight, quality control, and guidance for junior staff members.

Bob has completed numerous projects related to roadways, streetscapes, and accessibility, ranging from roadside and median landscaping to development of on-street bikeways, and ADA compliance evaluations for sidewalks and multi-use pathways. Through his professional practice, as well as his involvement with the NM Complete Streets Leadership Team and the American Society of Landscape Architects, he has also supported alternative transportation planning and design efforts in communities across the state. He recently served as project manager and lead designer for the development of more than 40 miles of onand off-street bicycle and pedestrian improvements intended to reconnect the six traditional villages that make up the Pueblo of Laguna, and led the landscape design as part of the reconstruction of a 1.5-mile stretch of Grand Ave/US 85 in Las Vegas, NM.
